Course Description: Tai Chi is a proven method of stress reduction and relaxation. It integrates the external or physical and the meditative internal. It improves balance, coordination, flexibility, muscle strength and cardiovascular health. It is gentle enough to be accessible to people of every ability level but can be demanding enough to provide a significant challenge to the professional athlete.

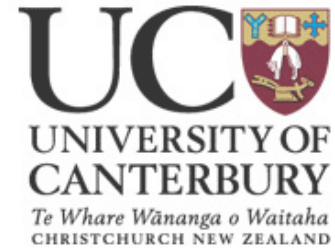

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Chinese Beginners 1

Course Description: This course focuses on developing the ability to communicate basic information in Mandarin Chinese. No previous knowledge of the language is assumed. With the assistance of Pinyin (the widely-used system for writing Chinese words with the Roman alphabet), participants will learn basic sentence structures and grammatical rules. Students will also learn to write a number of Chinese characters and acquire a vocabulary of 200 words for basic conversational use. The course is suitable for anyone interested in Chinese language and culture and, in particular, anyone contemplating travelling or working in China or any other Chinese speaking regions.

Instructor: Jessie (Yarong) Li. Ms Li is a post-graduate student at Huazhong University of Science and Technology in Wuhan, China and is currently a volunteer teacher for CIUC. She is a qualified Mandarin Language Instructor who has been selected by Hanban (the head of the Confucius Institutes in Beijing) to teach and promote Chinese in New Zealand.

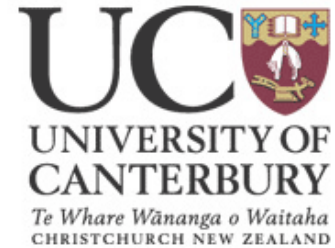

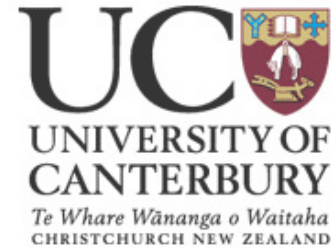

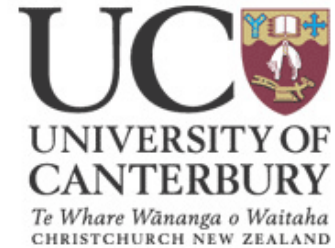

This course will focus on conversational language, but sentence structure will also be explored. Participants will also increase their vocabulary and writing skills.

Ms Cheng is a post-graduate student at Nanjing University of Information Science and Technology in Nanjing, China and is currently a volunteer teacher for the CIUC. She is a qualified Mandarin language instructor who has been selected by Hanban (the head office of Confucius Institute in Beijing) to teach and promote Chinese language in New Zealand.

This course will focus on developing participants' skill in formal language especially in reading comprehension and writing ability. Grammatical structures, vocabulary and written characters are also stressed.

Instructor: Dr Yan Zhou. She is a professor at the Huazhong University of Science and Technology in Wuhan, China and is currently a teacher for the CIUC. She is a qualified mandarin language instructor who has been selected by Hanban (the head office of Confucius Institute in Beijing) to teach and promote Chinese language in New Zealand.
